Choosing Alzheimer's disease as a focus project for my year as President of SI Chico was easy and clear. This disease has personally impacted my family and many families in our club. At retreat, our membership had many questions about the disease for the Directors from our local Alzheimer's Association. People shared personal stories of loved ones and friends. There were few in the room who had no connection to this disease. The importance of raising awareness and contributing funds to be part of the solution is paramount.

Alzheimer's holds spot number six of the ten top causes of death in America and is the only one without a way to prevent, cure or even slow its progression. In addition, Alzheimer's is more likely to affect women. 60% of caregivers are women and more women have the disease than men. Soroptimist is "Best for Women", Alzheimer's is the opposite.
