Soroptimist Orientation Leadership Training

In 1921, the first Soroptimist club,
Alameda County was formed in
California with over 80 business
and professional women from in
and around the city of Oakland.
With Violet Richardson as the first
President, back then the first club,
which changed its name to SI
Oakland in 1928, met weekly,
debating service projects and
hearing speakers on various
worldwide issues that would
broaden members' horizons

The first service project was 'Save the Redwoods' - the great ancient trees which were being felled. The club lobbied the legislature, taking on powerful lumber companies, and winning public support, which resulted in a major portion of the forest being set aside as protected land, that still exists today.

Additional Soroptimist clubs soon followed along the Pacific and Atlantic coasts, amounting to 15 clubs within 5 years, with a growing concern for women in their communities.
